Technology Grants

These grants may apply to your class or school:

1. The *History Channel* awards \$250,000 in grants to nonprofit organizations that collaborate with schools or youth groups on a preservation project. The project should feature aspects of active student involvement that covers learning about documenting and preserving their community. Nonprofit organizations such as museums, historical societies, preservation organizations, libraries and archives may partner with a local school or youth group to apply for funding.
