***Please read carefully to ensure that you are able to register successfully.***

- **VERY IMPORTANT:** Let us know which EDUC classes you will take, as *they may be cancelled if nobody has signed up*. This is especially true for classes taught by other than PUC faculty. **You can only register for courses with the prefix of EDUC or ECED. All other courses must be registered through Records at records@puc.edu.**
- Due to the intensive nature of these courses and seminars, it is recommended that you register for only one course at a time. However, it is not mandatory. You may not sign up for courses that overlap in time.
- **In order to access the internet at PUC** you will need to use your PUC email address and password. See the Education Summer School site for details.
- If you do not qualify for a tuition waiver, check the [website](#) for tuition costs.
- Failure to let Records and Education know you are dropping a class will affect your grade.
- Any extra fees for classes and workshops, including the \$75 technology fee, are not covered by your conference. **Technology fees for online classes as well as any materials fees, etc. for classes will be automatically charged to your account upon registration.** Check the schedule for information about fees for workshops and classes.
- All of the textbooks for classes are available online from the [PUC Bookstore](#) website. However, since the number of textbooks available is based on past enrollment, it is important to enroll early in order to be sure of obtaining a textbook. More textbooks will be ordered as needed, if there is enough time before class begins.

## **CLASS DETAILS**

**Class withdrawal dates:** Be sure to read the class syllabus carefully once you receive it, as there is a withdrawal deadline for all classes, including online classes. If you decided to drop a class after the withdrawal deadline you will receive either an “F” or a “Fail” for that class.

### **EDUC 420: Instrumental Techniques and Repair for Teachers**

This workshop is specifically for music teachers who want to improve their performance, pedagogical and basic repair skills with various instruments. Teaching credential not required. Class size is limited to 12, and the \$20 materials fee will automatically be charged to your account when you register.. Questions? ### **EDUC 420: DI Las Vegas, 1 & 2 credits**

The syllabus for this class will be posted on the Education Summer website shortly. Be sure to read carefully before deciding whether to take this class for 1 credit or 2, as you will be responsible for the work involved, and failure to complete will result in a failing grade.

### **EDUC 420: English Teacher Workshop 2016**

This is a new one-credit education workshop intended for junior high and secondary English teachers. During the week, you will have the chance to “talk shop” with other English teachers. Workshop participants will work independently and in groups on a variety of activities. You will have time for reading and quiet reflection. This is an opportunity to learn from fellow teachers and to share with others the methods that work well in your discipline. You’ll enjoy the beautiful Mendocino Coast while attending this class at PUC’s own Albion Retreat and Learning Center.

**June 27-30, 2016:** Class meets each morning from 9 am until noon. Afternoons will include time for reading, writing, and reflection. Optional afternoon outdoor activities are planned for workshop participants. Spouses and families are welcome (note, childcare is not provided by PUC or the Albion Retreat and Learning Center).

**Instructors:** The workshop will be facilitated by a PUC English professor Cynthia Westerbeck in collaboration with a high school English teacher. The instructors will facilitate discussions on best practices in teaching writing, reading, & critical thinking.

**Lodging and meals:** Workshop participants will stay at the Albion Retreat and Learning Center in comfortable cabins and eat all meals together in the campus Dining Commons. Lodging is \$200 per cabin (max occupancy is 4) and meals are \$120 per person for the week. Please make your reservations early by calling 707-937-5440.
