School-wide Implementation

4.0 **Beginning Implementation:**

- Teachers will start with one unit of study and create a unit plan keeping in mind the key question, "What do we want students to know and be able to do?"
- Principal/SBL Facilitator will devote time at staff meetings for discussions and questions on implementation progress.

3.0 Proficiency Scales Released:

- Principal/SBL Facilitator and teachers have worked through one subject's standards and have prioritized 10-12 standards for that subject.
- Principal/SBL Facilitator and teachers unpacked a subject's standard and have written a proficiency scale for that standard.
- Principal/SBL Facilitator and teachers can explain that SBL is identifying and articulating what students need to know and be able to do.
- Implement communication plan with stakeholders regarding the move to SBL.

2.0 Preparation to Receive Proficiency Scales (<u>ALC coursework</u>, attend Marzano trainings or read books) – Collaborative Groups:

- Principal/SBL Facilitator and teachers have completed all planapproved trainings related to Standards-based Learning available on <u>Adventist Learning Community OR</u> attended a formal Marzano training or conference-approved training.
- A level-2.0 training plan for the school has been approved by the local conference.
- Draft a plan for communication with stakeholders (parents, students, school board, etc.).

<u>Vocabulary</u>: Standards-based Grading, Standards-referenced Learning, anchor standards, priority scale, define what a score of 1.0, 2.0, 3.0 and 4.0 include on a proficiency scale.

1.0 Background Knowledge for Teachers and Administration:

- Have created an account on the Adventist Learning Community.
- Principal/SBL Facilitator has read <u>A School Leader's Guide to Standards-Based Grading</u> and collaborated "next steps" with the Local Conference Office of Education.
- Teachers have read A Teacher's Guide to Standards-Based Learning.

0.0 Principal/SBL Facilitator has read and communicated concepts of <u>Leading a</u> <u>High Reliability School</u> material to faculty/stakeholders.
